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Chair's report

As we reflect on the past year, Kids in Need Waikato has continued in our commitment to support children being raised by someone other than their biological parents, including support for their carer. We continue to provide the children with seasonal care packs of essential items, as well as offering programmes to support the wellbeing of both children and their carers.

Our Purpose, Vision and Values of the Trust remain unchanged and these have continued to be the cornerstone of everything we do.

The Trust distributed 1619 seasonal care packs during the period 1st April 2023 to 31st March 2024. These supported 455 caregivers, raising 1087 children requiring ongoing assistance, as well as one-off emergency packs. Each pack is lovingly and purposefully assembled to meet the age and needs of each individual child. Our annual Christmas campaign in December 2023 resulted in us providing gifts to 1142 children and their caregivers, made possible with incredible community support that continues to overwhelm us.

We partnered with Rotary Clubs around the region to distribute the gifts close to Christmas Day, which was a resounding success. We are immensely grateful to the support from Rotary District 9930 Governor, who nominated us his Charity of choice to all clubs in his district.

We have seen first-hand the trend in rising child poverty as reported by Stats NZ for the period ending June 2023. With 1 in 8 children – 143,700 – living in material hardship, demand for our regular care pack support has increased by 16% over the previous fiscal year and we are regularly contacted by a wide range of organisations with referrals.

The commitment of our team and unwavering support from our volunteers enables us to meet the needs of the growing number of caregivers needing support for the children they are raising. Not only have we continued to provide our grassroots care pack service, we have also developed and implemented programmes to support their wellbeing, offering respite, social connectedness and opportunities to participate in extracurricular activities.

Our collaboration with other organisations who support similar communities continues and we have built several new relationships over the year. These include but are not limited to, Caring Families, Stand Tu Maia, Dignity, Kindness Collective and Common Equal (formerly Koha Apparel). We are mindful of the greater impact we can achieve through working with others and not duplicating services.

We were able to replace our leased main vehicle in July 2023 with a brand new vehicle, made possible with generous funding from Grassroots Trust and Ebbett



Volkswagen. This has enabled our Founder, Linda Roil, to spend more time engaging in the community we support, offering assistance and advocacy, while making new connections to improve the overall support for this vulnerable community.

Our operational capabilities also expanded, with the construction of a new project and storage shed onsite, to support the increasing activities of the Charity. The new building was ready for our community Open Day on 12th November 2023, with around 350 people visiting our site and learning about the work we do.

After seeing the increasing demand on services and the potential for wellbeing programmes to expand, the Board conducted a review in early 2023, leading to a resolution to formally adopt the strategic goal of owning and developing the Kids in Need property at 118 Fencourt Road, Cambridge. Planning and preparation to enable funding of the purchase is a key focus for the 2024/25 financial year.

We also undertook a resourcing review and created two new part-time positions of Programme and Relationship Coordinator and Funding Coordinator, to enable us to extend our support to both children and caregivers in line with our vision. These positions have been filled, with us now employing a team of five paid part-time employees, supporting our Founder Linda who is a full time volunteer and Graeme Roil as a managing Trustee.

Our fundraising strategy was reviewed, resulting in the formation of a Fundraising and Sponsorship Committee, made up of staff and volunteers. This has set the framework for future fundraising focus and targets and also highlighted the need for us to consolidate and better manage our donor information. This has led to the implementation of a CRM donor management system which has been operational since July 2023. A recurring giving program was designed and launched at the same time and is now supported by 27 regular recurring donors.

We are deeply grateful for the unwavering support of our donors, funders, volunteers, and community partners. Their generosity, compassion, and commitment have been the driving force behind our success, fueling our efforts to make a lasting difference in the lives of those who need it most.

The Board expresses its gratitude to Linda, her team, and all those involved who contributed to the exceptional level of service provided throughout the year. We are looking ahead with optimism and determination, remaining committed to our mission.

2014

Our volunteers

Our volunteers are at the heart of everything we do, from sewing, mending and sorting to putting together and delivering care packs. We have over 30 part time volunteers who dedicate time each week to support the running of the charity.

We hosted 14 different volunteer groups from organisations and businesses over the year including 11 during our Christmas campaign.

Our volunteers collectively committed approximately 8000 hours of their time over the year.



Highlights

Care packs

Our main priority continues to be delivering personalised care packs that are lovingly put together by our team of volunteers and staff. Each care pack takes approximately one hour to complete and is made up of clothing, shoes, toiletries, seasonal items, books, activities, toys and a soft toy. We received referrals from 52 agencies from all over the Waikato.

Emergency Bags

After the weather events of early 2023, through the generous support of SkyCity Hamilton Community Trust Kids in Need was able to assemble and hand out 180 Emergency Bags to caregivers in the Waikato. The bags were intended to be the starting point for a family "Go-Bag" and included a family first aid kit, lamp (solar and battery powered), hand sanitiser, notebook, pen, water and wipes all packaged in a small, easy to carry backpack.

New Ute, new shed, new staff!

Through the generous support of Ebbett Volkswagen and a grant from Grassroots Trust we were able to replace our leased ute with a brand new vehicle.

Our new project and storage shed was completed in October just in time for the KIN Open Day and the Christmas campaign.

KIN also welcomed 2 new staff members in the roles of Funding Coordinator and Programme and Relationship Coordinator.

Supporting Caregivers

One of our key priorities for the year was continuing to provide support to caregivers. We hosted 15 coffee groups, with an average attendance of 7 people. We also provided other opportunities for respite including 2 KIN Day In events held onsite at KIN HQ, and our Big Day Out at Finlay Park Adventure Camp.

Open Day

KIN hosted an Open Day at our Cambridge HQ to bring the community together and raise awareness of our work. 350 people joined us over the day and enjoyed fun activities, food, tours and sunshine.



Christmas

Each year we support thousands of children around the region at Christmas time. We are incredibly grateful to the wider community who get behind the Christmas campaign and donate brand new gifts.

- 1142 children supported with 3789 presents
- **400** caregiver gifts
- 36 drop off points around the Waikato (including 20 public drop off points)
- 11 businesses helped with wrapping
- **16** rotary clubs involved in distributing gifts.
- **\$80,000** worth of gifts














Caregiver Feedback

We conducted our first Caregiver Feedback Survey – receiving 130 responses. The feedback was overwhelmingly positive.

- **78%** said the online pack request form was easy or very easy to fill in
- 97% gave our delivery / pick up process 5/5 rating
- **88%** gave our packs 5/5 satisfaction rating (average rating 4.85/5)
- The most helpful pack items were: Clothing, shoes, toiletries and underwear.
